Peering up at the Old World villa and vineyards, you’d swear you’re under the Tuscan sun. But nope, you’re in North County at the recently upgraded **Bridges at Rancho Santa Fe**. The 16-year-old private club and community is enjoying a growth spurt among younger San Diegans. As opposed to RSF’s old-school clubs, people are drawn to The Bridges’ tennis club and bocce ball court—both redone by in-demand S.D. designer Paul Basile—as well as its rec center and dog park. Add to that organic

farm-to-table cuisine, a dining room remodeled with high-top tables and an ultramodern wine-on-tap system. Since 2007, the club has seen a 35 percent boost in the number of families with children moving into the community and joining. When investment banker Tim Oitzman relocated from the San Francisco area, he wanted the Robert Trent Jones II-designed golf course, but would this be the right place to raise his kids? “It turns out there were a lot of young families moving in,” he says. “It’s like living in Mayberry.” —*Jack Skelley*
